

The icing on the cake was a visit to the Keystone VHF Club's site on Rocky Ridge in York, PA and also attending the April KVHF meeting. The club's president threatened to have me preside at the meeting but I did not have my referee shirt and whistle along. My ham radio timing

was right on; the York Hamfest was held while I was there so I was able to attend that and visit with some OLD ham radio buddies. Bought some stuff I really needed.

Freida and I returned to Jenkinsburg for a couple of days of R&R and then headed to Savannah for the 2016 Emergency Management Association of Georgia (EMAG) Convention. Mike Crowe (AJ4GU), Ken Reid (KG4USN) and I were

presenters (Georgia ARES Digital Capabilities) at a Wednesday afternoon break-out session. Georgia ARES also had a well attended booth in the vendor's display area. The booth was set up and staffed by George Olive (AI4UR) and David Benoist (AG4ZR). George is the DeKalb EC and David is the Georgia ARES SEC. There were several excellent speakers: Jim Butterworth (GA OHS/EMA Director), Lt. Michael Madden (San Bernardino, CA Police Department (1st guy on scene at the December 2015 terrorist attack) and Stephanie Decker (Tornado Survivor). Many, many informative break-out sessions and vendor displays.

If you have any questions or are having trouble with GA ARES Database access, please let me know.

We will be busy in May. Jessica McFadden, Red Cross Disaster Program Manager, will attend our May training and talk to us about the Red Cross. On May 7th our ARES team will be providing course communications for a 5K Fun Run. The 3+ mile run will be held on city streets in the vicinity of the football stadium. The event is a fund raiser for the Jackson "Red Devils" football team (equipment, uniforms, etc.). We still have a few "on course" openings. Should be a fun morning; good training and it may satisfy the annual ARRL Simulated Emergency Test

requirement. An HT should be sufficient.

I have been playing around with the JT-65 weak signal mode. My signal must be pretty weak, I have not made many contacts yet. JT-65 is a digital mode and it counts for DXCC so it will probably be a mode we can try during Field Day. What? Field Day? Yep, Field Day is next month so mark your calendars: June 25 & 26. Field Day is a two day, all day event so plan to spend the weekend. Remember also that our annual club family picnic is held on that Saturday evening. See Darlene, KK4BKF, for details.
