



FROM THE BACKACRE - BUZZ (K3GWK) Butts County Emergency Coordinator

September was a busy month for our growing VE Team. Dan (W4DED) presided over two successful VE sessions. There was one upgrade to General (BCECA Team Member KK4SKY) at the Jackson session and a new Technician (another Strite) and two upgrades to General at the ham-fest session in Covington. Thank you to Dan and our VE team for continuing to help grow this super-duper hobby.

Several lessons learned from the Dixie Pipeline FSE: In the future, whether a drill or actual

event, there needs to be a separate Net Control Station involved, one not located at a traffic handling site – Sylvan Grove, 911/EOC, etc. Especially with digital messaging, there needs to be a "traffic cop" to prevent doubling and provide control and tracking of all the message traffic. Logging, and a designated logger, must be part of the operation at every station involved. (All of the IS-214 Units Log sheets were returned blank.)

There is a saying in EMS (it probably applies elsewhere), "If you don't write it down, it did not happen." I do not believe that "time sensitive" messages need to be sent using NBEMS. There is too much delay in the process. Digital messages are great for lists, directions and work instructions; something that would require lots of writing and accurate spelling. This is my opinion and certainly open for discussion.

We also must make our presence known at the locations we serve and we must be proficient at what we do. It is why we should all participate in exercises like the SET and Public Service activities and in regular voice and digital nets. Practice, practice, practice...

On Saturday, 15OCT, in cooperation with Clayton/Henry ARES, we will be holding another "Digital Workshop" session. This one will feature Fldigi and Flmsg (NBEMS). Mike Crowe (AJ4GU) will be coordinating the class. It will be an opportunity to get the NBEMS software loaded, set-up and tested. Bring your laptop and Signalink. If you have a portable digital station, bring that also. Thanks, in advance, to Roy (AJ4GT), the Clayton/Henry



EC for arranging the use of the Clayton FD training facility.

Dennis (KM4MHW), our 2017 Field Day chairman, reports that all of the designated committee positions are filled. Thanks to all who have volunteered. Remember, we all need to be working on making contacts on PSK and JT65. The practice will help us improve our score next year. N3FJP, the developer of our logging software, has added Fldigi logging capabilities to the FD Logger program. Hooray!

Our ACTIVE ARES membership remains at 30 with 6 PENDING (KG4GHM, KM4KZM, KM4QMH, KM4VHO,

KM4VPS, KM4VPY and N3TLH). There were 6 activities in June (104 Hours). A total of eight nets: four FM Phone and four WL2K tests (45 Hours). We are getting a great response to our weekly WL2K test. When you send your Sunday WL2K test message to WX4BCA and WX4GMA remember to use an ICS-213 form, WINMOR or Packet if possible.

The "Spin for Kids" bike ride is coming up on October 16th. This event is held in

Morgan County and is a great way to practice "portable operations". It is a high profile event and raises a pile of money for Camp Twin Lakes. This is a great Public Relations opportunity for Amateur Radio. If you can help out, let me know.

The Stone Mountain Hamfest is the weekend of November 5 and 6 (yep two days!). There will be plenty of vendors, tail-gating and some really good forums. Gordon West, WB6NOA (via SKYPE) and David Freese, W1HKJ (author of Fldigi), will be featured speakers on Sunday.
