Our April meeting was well-attended as we christened our new location at the Butts County Fairgrounds. The more we grow, the greater is our opportunity to make a difference "when all else fails."

Last month's speaker, Steve Hudson (AA4BW) gave us an interesting look at QRP operation. The FCC's guidelines regarding power is: "use only as much power as you need." We discovered that we really don't need a lot of power to effect a successful contact especially in the digital modes. I was genuinely surprised to see how the math works for QRP in the *minimal* reduction of "S" units with a *maximum* reduction in output power! Thanks again to Buzz for lining up such interesting and informative programs each month.

Our major training opportunity in April was our *Special Event Station* W4D at the Bluebirds and Bluegrass Festival at Dauset Trails. There was a good turn-out for breakfast followed by a large

number of our club members who helped to setup the radios, antennas and other equipment. After a dry period of no contacts, we thought to check the antenna with an analyzer and found a problem in the antenna system. After putting up a wire dipole at about 15 feet, we were all a little surprised when we started making contacts with New York, Wisconsin, Texas, Canada and South America! Congratulations to Nancy Phillips (K4NEP) who made her very *first* HF contacts and who made the *most* contacts during the day! Many thanks to Elaine (KW4AQ) and her team for getting a special event call sign for the day and for all the work that went into the exercise.

The month of May will be a busy month for the club. We will again this year provide emergency communications for the Jackson High School football team's 5K fundraiser. 

I believe our new meeting location will work out just fine. Thanks again to the well connected Nancy Phillips (K4NEP) for making the arrangements. We now have plenty of room for growth so let's all do some recruiting and fill up the seats. We have a two Saturday Technician Class planned for July (8 and 15). This will be a good opportunity to add folks to our great hobby and "talk-up" our group. We have licensed 116 Technicians through our HamCram efforts (17 HamCrams since March 2010) but only gained 22 BCECA members.

Have you ordered your new QRP rig yet? I talked to Karla (KJ4TVP) after the meeting; she is pretty excited about learning CW and getting a QRP station to take along on her future hiking adventures. If you haven't found a QRP radio yet (remember the Atlanta Hamfest is June 3rd), have you tried turning the power down? I have been playing around with JT65, a weak signal digital mode, and have been amazed at where my '20 watts and

a wire' signal is being heard. Our ARES activity for April totaled 500 Ham Hours; the value of that time was just about \$12,000.

There were five FM Voice Nets in April. NCS Melvin (KK4QJR) with his assistant Susan Bennett, did a really great job as Net Control. Really quite an accomplishment! Ken (KM4HOS) and Mel spent several hours getting the talking NCS program to work. Thanks guys! Ken was an NCS for the Sunday GA Digital Traffic Net and was pretty busy, so the after net Fldigi tests were suspended for April. There was a message test after the 30 April net; only had one reply. Don't forget about our two digital oppor-

tunities on Sunday; WL2K to WX4BCA (ICS-213 please) and

the Fldigi test following FM net. Sending a Telnet WL2K message on Sundays is a great way for members who can't use FM repeater to maintain their required monthly tivity. There were five training opportunities (94 Ham Hours) and one Public Service event (8 Ham Hours); Cheerio Challenge support (AK4EM and N4TZY). We had a pile of Miscellaneous hours this month (300). Thanks to Ken (KM4HOS), Dan



(W4DED), Nancy (N4NEP), Mike (AJ4GU), Mark (NI2Y) and patient X for their hard work installing the new UHF/VHF station at the Butts County Health Department office. Our DPH Nurse Manager, Krystle Whitten, really supports our efforts, arranging the funds and getting permission from the county BOC for us to install the equipment. Ken made the very first net contact when he checked in via D-STAR to the Georgia Public Health Net (30B) on Thursday morning. We now have three "Public Safety Support" stations available in Butts County.

Our ARES roster now stands at thirty-three (+1). There are nineteen ACTIVE members (Jeff Phillips, KN4FRG has completed all six of the required courses) and four PENDING members. The PENDING members must complete a Basic ARES course, IS-100, IS-700 and IS-802 to achieve full ACTIVE status. Only four of our ACTIVE members have completed the four required basic courses. Come on folks, let's get this done. Eight ACTIVE members still need to complete a Basic ARES Course. Remember to include Butts County (EC Buzz Kutcher K3GWK) when you register for the Gwinnett Basic ARES course. Eight need ICS-100, twelve need to complete ICS-700

and eighteen need to complete ICS-802. Check your GA ARES Database data and make sure your records are accurate. If you have any questions, please see me after the meeting.

We still have two open meeting presentation slots; October and November. Elaine is working on Tom Rauch (W8JI) and I have contacted Jim Reed (N4BFR) to see if he is available to talk to our group about the RaspberryPi as it relates to ham radio. A RaspberryPi board is the heart of our new D-STAR repeater. The Basic CERT class will continue until May 30.
