2014 WAS A GREAT YEAR FOR THE BCECA CLUB The Year 2014 was a great year for our Butts

County Amateur Radio Club. Our club continued to grow in number and activity. This is due in large part to the seasoned leadership offered by Buzz (K3GWK), Mike (AJ4GU) and Dan (W4DED). These guys are great examples of the best of the hobby and have been indispensable "Elmers" to so many of us.

January was busy with our first HamCram of the year. Our HamCrams have proved to be an effective way to bring new hams into the hobby and new members into our club. We also began an Amateur Extra preparation class in January. Several of the stu-



dents were successful in attaining the much sought-after Amateur Extra Class license.

January is also the month of our big Georgia State ARES meeting. A good number of our club members attending the annual training/ informing/fellowshipping meeting at the GPSTC.

February brought some severe winter weather and a pretty good blanket of snow to Butts County. During the snow storm our Emergency Weather Net was activated.

In March Mike (AJ4GU) gave us a "Digital Tune-Up" introducing many of our new hams to FLDigi, EchoLink and RMS Express.

April was busy as we set up an information booth and radio station at the Bluebirds & Bluegrass Festival at Dauset Trails. We introduced ham radio to many attendees.

In May our club took a "field trip" to the National Weather Service office in Peachtree City. We observed the launch of a weather balloon and toured the NWS facility.

The big event every **June** is Field Day. A large group of club members assembled and staffed a remote radio station at the Locust Grove United Methodist Church recreation area for two days. When the dust settled, our club had won 1st place in our category for the entire state of Georgia!

> Another HamCram took our attention in **July** with a good attendance and great results. Two of our group upgraded to Amateur Extra and one upgraded to General.

Our big event in August was our very first "Newbie Night." Ed (WX4ED) put to-

gether a curriculum aimed at helping our new hams hit the ground running.

In September club members helped to construct and staff a booth at the Butts County Fair. A VHF station was on the air and, for our efforts, we even won a ribbon!

October was very busy with a S.E.T. simulation and booth and "Special Event Station" at the Jenkinsburg Founders Day. Jenkinsburg mayor, David Nestor expressed deep appreciation for our participation.

November featured a V.E. Session and reinstitution of our "Hungry Hams" group.

December's big event was our annual Christmas party at Buckner's Restaurant. A good time (and lots of chicken) was had by all!

This year (2015) marks the 54th (nearly) consecutive year that the Georgia QSO Party (GQP) has been challenging amateurs all over the world with the best award/plaque program in the US.

In 2014, 272 amateurs submitted logs vying for the thirty-nine award plaques that were earned.

The GQP is held in a pair of ten-hour sessions on the second full weekend in April; this year that's April 11-12, 2015. We expect all 159 Georgia counties to be on the air.


NOMINATING COMMITTEE REPORT DAN (W4DED)

Vice-president—The Vice-president assumes the duties of the President in his absence.

Secretary—The Secretary keeps and maintains minutes of meetings, maintains a member roster, reads and initiates club correspondence. He/she is responsible to maintain a copy of the Constitution and By-Laws at all club meetings.





Treasurer—The Treasurer's duties are many primarily consisting of collecting, maintaining and dispersing club monies while keeping a detailed and orderly account of these funds.

Officers are elected for a period of two years and may serve no more than three consecutive terms.

GAARES Georgia Amateur Radio Emergency Service

FROM THE BACKACRE — **BUZZ** (**K3GWK**) Emergency Coordinator

December began with our 4th Anniversary and Christmas Party held again this year at Buckner's Restaurant. We had a pretty good turnout; there were illnesses that kept some folks away but I think those of us who attended had a real good time.

At the 2013 Christmas Party we were presented with our club's ARRL Affiliation Certificate. This year the big event was the very first presentation of the travelling "Locust Grove Transmitting Society Georgia QSO Party" trophy. This year the LGTSGQSOP trophy was won by David Burnham, AK4EM. Congratulations David! The competition is open to all members, General class and up. Normal GAQP rules apply + 100 watts & no beams!

We had a busy year. Our ARES roster lists 28 members, 20 Active and 8 Deployable. We have 9 hams on the roster who are considered Pending because they have not yet completed an ARES Registration form. All 28 members have participated in at least one activity in 2014. There were a total of 81 nets held this year, 27 using Winlink2000. The participation in our WL2K net has continued to grow and includes stations from several counties. (Just another tool in the toolbox.) The VHF repeater has had its share of issues this year; the new box (purchased by AJ4GU)

has been on the air since June. We have experienced ongoing antenna issues and have had to use the 146.715 repeater in McDonough occasionally but we have only missed a

couple of Sundays due to repeater issues. Of the 81 nets that were conducted this year 6 were SKYWARN Storm Spotter operations. Thanks again to Mike Crowe, AJ4GU, for his continued support.

Our ARES team participated in 53 training opportunities; a total of 1448 ham hours. Those events included Field Day #3, providing communications support for a local 5K fun-run on Labor Day, participating in the annual Bluebird & Blue Grass Festival at Dauset Trails, setting up and manning an information booth at the Butts County Fair and participating in the 125th Founder's Day Festival in Jenkinsburg. During the Jenkinsburg festival we operated a "limited" Special Event station and also used that station as the Incident Command location for the 2014 ARRL Simulated Emer-

gency Test.

There were 18 various events, including our two

HamCrams and six VE Sessions, antenna work and

meetings, accounting for 207 ham hours. I need to mention here that the founder of our VE Team, Jess Porter (W4DNS) has relocated to Florida and turned operation of the team over to Dan Darsey (W4DED). Dan hit the ground running and the team continues testing sessions on the 3rd Saturday of every odd month. We have added several more VEs this year, several as Extra Class examiners. If you are interested in joining the VE Team (only desire and a General license are required), contact Dan.

The 2014 Field Day was the best one so far. We made 657 contacts for a total of 2,384 points. That score put BCECA in the #1 spot in Georgia for 2A stations. 2A means a club station. operating 2 transmitters on non-commercial power. Our 2015 Field Day operation will relocate to the new pavilion at the Butts County Recreation Center. David (AK4EM) and Randy (NV4RB) will again be our Field Day captains.

I would like to thank everyone who got involved in ARES this year. Our small group has the rest of the Atlanta Metro District paying attention. We have made a lot of progress and have put Butts County on the Georgia ham radio map.

One sad note in closing; Bart Smith's father (WA4BWJ) passed away on Sunday. Please keep Bart and his family in your prayers.
