

"Royal Order of The Wouff Hong." The ROWF was started by Hiram Percy Maxim in the early 1900's to combat QRM and poor operators. Guess some things never change. The ceremony is all in fun and everyone had a good time participating in this Amateur Radio tradition.

On 19AUG Mike Crowe and I participated in a Table Top Exercise, preparing for the Public Health "Strategic National Stockpile" exercise coming up in November. ARES state-wide will be participating also; this will be our SET for 2015. It turned out to be a real good session, a learning experience for everyone attending, especially the folks from Georgia Public Health.

Mike and I did a demonstration of Fldigi and Flmsg. Nonhams are always impressed; they are stunned when you tell them it is free. Hopefully, this will help us get

our foot in the door at the Public Health office in Butts County.

Don't forget about the outstanding training opportunity next Saturday morning, 9 AM in the Education Building at Piedmont Henry Hospital. We will be using Bays A, B and C. Just follow the signs. There is plenty of adjacent parking. The first session, by John Davis (WB4QDX) will be

on D-Star and DRATS. After lunch, Mike Crowe will facilitate a Digital Tune-Up session. Bring your laptops and Go-Kits. Breakfast? Yep, 8 AM at the Hardees at exit 222. We are one of the hosting groups so let's have a good turn-out. We will soon have D-Star capabilities at the hospital. DRATS is Internet based (I think).

EMA Director Glen Goens has started a Basic CERT class held on the 2nd and 4th Monday (6:00 PM) at Station 7. We have a couple of ARES members in the class. CERT is a great way to get some extra "out of the box" training.



Three-Wire Extension Cord Whitney Smith (WA4VBX)





Three-Wire Extension Cord (Continued) Whitney Smith (WA4VBX)

2) OR, TWIST THE WIRE END, SOLDER THE TIP END OF THE WIRE TO KEEP FROM LINRAVELING, AND WRAP THE WIRE AROUND THE SCREW AND TIGHTEN THE SCREW, THIS METHOD ALSO REQUIRES SOME CARE. 3) OR, TWIST THE WIRE END AND SOLDER ABOUT 3/4" OF WIRE. FORM THE WIRE AROUND THE SCREW, AND TAKE A HAMMER AND LIGHTLY FLATTEN THE SOLDERED WIRE, PUT THE FORMED WIRE AROUND THE SCREW AND TIGHTEN THE SCREW. THIS METHOD REDUITES SOME CARE. 4) IF YOU HAVE A COMPRESSION CONNECTION, TWIST THE WIRE END AND TIGHTEN THE SCREW, IF THERE IS ENOUGH ROOM, THE TIP END OF THE WIRE MAY OR MAY NOT BE SOLDERED. 5) EACH OF THESE WILL WORK, I HAVE TRIED THEM ALL, AND THERE MAY BE OTHER METHODS. CHOOSE THE METHOD THAT WORKS BEST FOR YOU.
